Mabry Mill is a stop in the Blue Ridge Parkway in southern Virginia. As I recall, we were there fairly late one afternoon on a lightly overcast day. I liked how the surrounding woods and millpond framed the mill. The shoreline of the pond became my leading line. I made only a few adjustments to the original image. I cropped to a 5:4 ratio, and darkened some highlights to bring out the detail on the roof. I use a Sony A550 camera. The image was shot at ISO 200, f6.3 and I/I25 sec. I made the print on my Canon Pro-10 printer.
